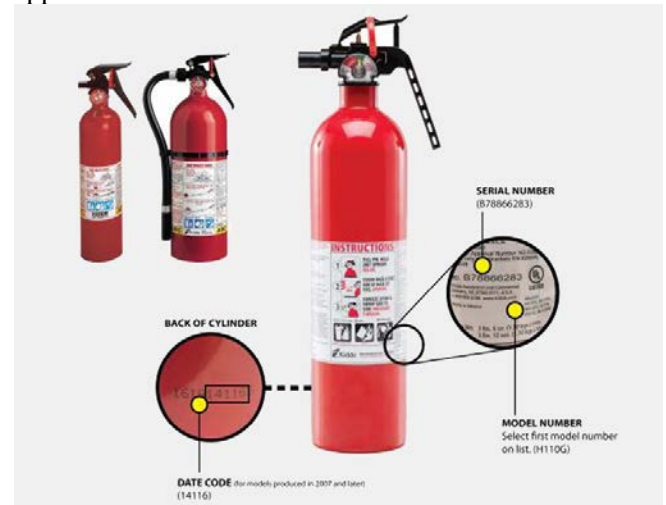

Check Your Boat Fire Extinguisher

Kidde has recalled more than 40 million fire extinguishers used in homes, vehicles, and boats because they can become clogged or fail to discharge during a fire. The recall includes 134 models manufactured as far back as 1973 and as recently as August 2017. All the units have a plastic handle or plastic push button. Units with a metal handle or valve assembly are not included in the recall. The plastic handles and buttons can break or detach when force is applied.



The fire extinguishers were sold under dozens of different brand names, all listed on the [Consumer Product Safety Commission recall notice](#).

Kidde is offering free replacements to anyone who owns one or more of the recalled units. To claim a replacement, check the brand name and model number of your fire extinguisher against the CPSC recall notice. The model numbers are printed on the body of the fire extinguisher. You can call Kidde at 855-271-0773 or visit the [Kidde website](#), where you can fill out a form to get a new unit.

CRSA Has a New Webhost and Site

CRSA experienced some pretty marked increases in the cost of hosting the website. The annual base cost doubled in the last two years and was going to increase again this coming April to \$1080 per year. Miscellaneous extra expenses would bring the total web charges to over \$1200 per year. In addition, the site was getting so large we were soon going to have change to a more advanced platform which would be even more expensive.

The rapid price increases caused **Mark Breeden** and new webmaster **Savanna Moeller** to search for better options. The result is a new site host and system based on the popular WORDPRESS web platform which provides several advantages. First, CRSA owns all the files and more readily can move them to different hosting and storage sites in the future if needed. Second, CRSA has more flexibility to make changes. Third, the new platform gives CRSA more website builders and applications with which to work in addition to what is used now i.e. Events, Memberships, and an Ecommerce plugin. Fourth, and probably most important, the annual cost will be around \$400 this year rather than \$1,200.



What Does This Change Mean to Members?

First, a stronger password is required. Resetting to a stronger password, or adjusting for a lost or forgotten one is easily done through e-mail. Follow these simple steps:

- Go to caverunsailing.org
- Click on **login** at top of page
- Type in **Username** This is usually your first and last name with NO spaces
- Type in **old password** from old site.
- Click on **LOG IN** Square
- If you have **forgotten** your old password you will receive an error page. Here you may enter the correct password, drop down the page to reset the password, or register as a new member with a new password.

- To **change** your password Click on **Member**, Search for your name, click on **setting button** on Profile line. Follow instructions.

You can also change what is visible to other members in this section.

Second, an Ecommerce store is now included. Presently only CRSA Burgees are listed for sale. Other items will be available to members at other times of the year. This is where rentals of the Miss Kelly and/or the Sunfish boats to members will be handled. Payments can be made electronically with a PayPal button using either a credit card or a PayPal account, or with a check mailed in through a manual payment button.

Third, a more versatile Events-Calendar plug-in is included that will allow scheduling events, making and keeping track of reservations and paying for tickets.

Fourth, in the Member section, each member can choose which items in their profile can be seen by other members. Privacy of member information is a part of the reason that a stronger password is required. A member can post picture to the website that will only be available to other members. The new site also has an open blog feature but this is currently turned off.

Want to Get Really Mooned?

Few things are as really neat or as much fun as full moon sailing and camping out overnight on Cave Run Lake. If you have not tried it, **YOU SHOULD**. It is spectacular on a clear night. When you anchor be sure to do so with a



clear view of the Eastern Shoreline. Below are the **weekends** of the full moon for 2018 along with the **approximate times the full moon will rise.** The weekend before the moon will be waxing, bright and setting at midnight or later.

May 25-28	18:00 – 20:00
June 29-30	22:00 – 23:00

In-laws, Outlaws and Bylaws

My husband has a favorite saying. ... My family are the in-laws and his family are the outlaws. Once again, Ben is spot-on with his assessments of character. This led me to look up the word *bylaw* or *by-law*. Yes, it's the rules governing an organization. But you can also spell it *byelaw*, which may be more appropriate when replacing old verbiage with new.

Periodically every organization, including CRSA, needs to take a fresh look at its bylaws to fine-tune the regulations or principles that guide them. Last year, drum roll please, the Executive Committee proposed two changes to our bylaws, which were approved at our annual dinner meeting last November.

The first change was to bylaw #3, to reflect how technology has increased our flexibility in getting business accomplished. The sentence in italics has been added to our bylaws:

3. Executive Committee meetings shall be conducted by Robert's Rules of Order except as modified by the bylaws.

Electronic or on-line voting (such as by email) by the Executive Committee will follow the same rules as that required for non-electronic voting.

The second change was to bylaw #5, to better reflect how a quorum is defined. One phrase has been deleted and another phrase has been added:

5. Quorum: The number of members of the Executive Committee and/or regular members at any meeting shall constitute a quorum. For all decisions made by the Executive Committee requiring a vote, a motion shall pass or fail with a simple majority of all Executive Committee members, but no less than 5.

CRSA 2018 CRUISE II: VICTORIA, BRITISH COLUMBIA AND SAN JUAN ISLANDS FLOTILLA

June 30-July 6, 2018

CRSA will be doing a second cruise this year with Merritt Wade as Cruise Captain joining an American Sailing Association (ASA) flotilla cruising off the west coast of Washington and Canada. The flotilla will consist of 6-12 boats chartered from San Juan Sailing and leaving from Bellingham, Washington. There will be several group dinners as well as plenty of time to explore on your own.



Departing from Bellingham, we sail to Reid Harbor on Stewart Island for a cedar planked barbeque. The next day sailing to Victoria on Vancouver Island for 2 nights. Anchored in the harbor of downtown Victoria, enjoy festivals and music in this majestic place. On Tuesday we sail to Roche Harbor on San Juan Island for 2 nights where we will enjoy their 4th of July festivities, including a potluck dinner and the front row seats to the fireworks. On Thursday we sail to Rosario Resort and Spa for a relaxing day. On Friday we return to Bellingham. Total sailing, 107 nautical miles. The area is known for stunning scenery and wild life while Victoria is famous for European charm. With luck we will see the resident pod of Orcas. A current passport is required as we will go through Canadian and US Customs.



We will be challenged as sailors with tidal currents, fog and shipping lanes. This cruise is suitable for experienced and new sailors. CRSA Commodore Valerie Askren and husband Ben have sailed here several times chartering from San Juan Sailing and recommend both. Last year CRSA chartered

two boats for a cruise to the same location which everyone enjoyed immensely.

One boat is reserved for seven people, three are already committed. More information on the flotilla and the boats is available at

COST and Schedule: The estimated cost of the cruise is \$827 per person, based on two per cabin and seven per boat. If we do not fill the boat, the cost will increase. Captains have first cabin pick followed by crew in order of receipt of the deposit check. To reserve a cabin, a deposit of **\$400 per person** is required and Due April 15th. Final Payment due May 1. Deposits and final payments can be refunded after the deadlines if a substitute crew member can be found.
